



# WIA VICTORIA TURBO TUTORIAL



### INFORMATION FOR CANDIDATES

This intensive theory course is tailored to provide special tuition to upgrade to a FULL AOCP licence. Enrolment is only available to existing Novice licensees or those who have recently passed the NAOCP Theory. An examination will be conducted on completion of the course.

### VENUE:

Chadstone Community Centre (Formerly Chadstone High School), Rob Roy Street, Chadstone. Ample car parking available.

#### IMES:

SATURDAY OCTOBER 18. The class commences at 9am and finishes at 4pm. There will be a 40min break for hunch and two 10min breaks during the day.

Candidates will be provided with a "Trial Examination" to be taken home and completed on Saturday night.

SUNDAY OCTOBER 19. The class commences at 9am and will finish at 1pm. Following a 1hr lunch break AN EXAMINATION will be conducted at 2pm and finish at 3.30pm.

### MEALS:

Candidates should bring their own lunch. Tea and coffee will be provided on a self serve basis.

### ENROLMENT:

The total cost, including the AOCP theory exam fee, is \$120.00 and places are strictly limited. ALL BOOKINGS MUST BE MADE AND FEE PAID IN ADVANCE TO THE WIA VICTORIA OFFICE.

Class notes will be provided. Bring pens, paper, calculators etc. COURSE ENROLMENTS AND APPLICATIONS TO SIT THE AOCP THEORY EXAM CLOSE ON TUESDAY OCTOBER 2nd AT NOON.

As venue and instruction costs must be paid NO REFUNDS will be made for any reason excepting rancellation or postponement by WIA VICTORIA.

During the course, a special theory syllabus will be covered to help bridge the knowledge gap between NAOCP and AOCP. Those who enrol will be expected to do some home-study between lectures and complete a TRIAL EXAMINATION for return the next morning.
