LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I have just bought a Japanese Kenpro KA50 1:1 balun and have found that the instruction manual makes for very interesting reading:

"KENPRO" Products Balun for Doublet Antennas, Model KA-50, KA75

The KA-50 and KA-75 are balanced to unbalanced converter. The KA-50/75 are usefull to connect unbalanced coaxial cable to balanced antenna systems such as doublet antennas. Direct connection coaxial cable to such antenna is occurred various bad harms of TVI, BCI or directivity discrepancy in radio reception due caused electric currency leakage to outside of braided wire.

The manual contained some other gems but I thought that one the best. I must remember it next time I am instructing a Foundation Class on the advisability of the use of a balun when feeding a dipole with coax!
