#### Solar storm of 1859

### The Carrington Event

During the period of August 28<sup>th</sup> to September 2<sup>nd</sup> numerous solar flares and sunspots where observed then on September 1<sup>st</sup> British Astronomer Richard Carrington detected a large solar flare that resulted in a massive coronal mass ejection (CME). This CME was on a direct course with the earth taking about seventeen hours to get here. This in itself was a remarkable point as most CME's take three to four days to reach the earth as they are travelling rather slowly. The reason this CME moved so fast was it was following a former CME that had cleared the path of ambient solar wind plasma. This ejection was to be known as the Carrington super flare.

When the CME hit the earth it resulted in the largest Geomagnetic storm in recorded history. It arrived on the evening of September the 1<sup>st</sup> in to the 2<sup>nd</sup>. The storm resulted in Aurora that where seen all over the world. Including the Caribbean and over the Rocky mountains they were so bright that they awakened gold miners who started making breakfast thinking it was already morning.

People awake in the the northern USA could read by the light of the Aurora they were so bright. On September the 3<sup>rd</sup> a newspaper the *Baltimore American and Commercial Advertiser* reported as follows...

"Those who happened to be out late on Thursday night had an opportunity of witnessing another magnificent display of the auroral lights. The phenomenon was very similar to the display on Sunday night, though at times the light was, if possible, more





Image of Coronal Mass Ejection

brilliant, and the prismatic hues more varied and gorgeous. The light appeared to cover the whole firmament, apparently like a luminous cloud, through which the stars of the larger magnitude indistinctly shone. The light was greater than that of the moon at its full, but had an indescribable softness and delicacy that seemed to envelop everything upon which it rested. Between 12 and 1 o'clock, when the display was at its full brilliancy, the quiet streets of the city resting under this strange light, presented a beautiful as well as singular appearance."

Telegraph systems over North America and Europe failed in some cases shocking the operators. Sparks flew from the wires and it was reported that the telegraphs would operate with out having a power supply connected due to the induced current in the lines.







# NASA Standard Wire Splicing The linesman's splice...

- 1. The conductors shall be pre-tinned.
- 2. There shall be at least 3 turns around each conductor and the wraps shall be tight with no gaps between adjacent turns
- 3. The wraps shall not overlap and the ends of the wrap shall be trimmed flush prior to soldering to prevent protruding ends.
- 4. Conductors shall not overlap the insulation of the other wire
- 5. Solder shall wet all elements of the connection.
- 6. The solder shall fillet between connection elements over the complete periphery of the connection.

Some of these numbers are too close to squeeze in between them. So below is a list of lengths that do not fall on these ½ wave lengths or multiples. They are a good starting point for a wire antenna or even the two halves of a dipole that should tune up with an ATU across multiple bands. (You may want to make a note of them)

These lengths have been calculated out to 500 feet or about 152 meters you could go longer but I will leave the maths up to you, that and you would need a pretty large property to put that amount of wire in the air. Thanks to VE3EED for the original calculations...

GGREC members may be interested to know about our upcoming DX-pedition. The ODXG is once again off to Vanuatu.

We arrive on 21st April and should be on-air approx 0600utc. We depart on 5th May. This year there are 6 operators, including 3 GGREC members; Chris VK3QB, Brenton VK3CBV and Michael VK3GHM. The other operators are Lee VK3GK, Luke VK3HJ and Allan VK2CA.

We'll be operating 3 stations this year, all Kenwood TS-480 radios. Antennas will be a combination of verticals on the beach and a 80mtr wire dipole up about 15mtrs supported by coconut palms.



We plan to get a much better 160m antenna up this year and hope it will improve our signal, both on receive as well as transmit. We will try to be active every evening on 160 and 80mtrs, as many amateurs need to work Vanuatu on these low bands.
