

THE DIE-CAST DROP-FORGED PLASTIC TRICHOTOMETRIC INDICATOR-SUPPORT

Inquiries concerning the mounting of the Trichotometric Indicator Support indicate that some difficulty is being experienced with the brackets which attach the support.

As an aid toward fabricating the support brackets, the accompanying illustration is provided to show the type of material as well as the dimensional data needed. It will be noted that in attaching the bracket to the support a special ambimelical hex nut is used.

The application of this nut is unique in that any attempt to remove it in the conventional manner only tightens it. Because of this design, the nut must be fully screwed on before it can be screwed off.

Business arising from the previous minutes :

Mid-Year Dinner: A good time was had by all. Photos will be placed on the club website. Thanks to Naree and Wayne for scoping out the venue. Members are asked to starting thinking where our next lunch should be. Perhaps somewhere to the north of Cranbourne?

Beacons: Rob VK3BRS reported that power amps are now held for the 23cm and 13cm beacons. Both units will be set so that we get maximum longevity out of them. They will be fan-cooled. We have managed to get a \$400 grant from the WIA to enable them to be GPS locked, courtesy of

an arrangement with Alan VK3XPD. A site survey will be undertaken prior to installation of the new antennas. At this stage, consideration is being given to Alford slot antennas. A generous donation of cable for the project has been made by Geoff, VK3HGG – thank you very much, Geoff. Telstra Museum: Bruno reported that the tours, in Hawthorn, at the telephone exchange, take place only on Wednesdays during daylight hours. They seemed reluctant to consider an evening visit. Further enquiries to be made, and level of interest of members to be gauged. Working Bee: The working bee held on 31 May was very successful. Thanks to Diane VK3JDI and Ian VK3BUF for the use of their boom lift on the day. Thanks also to Graeme VK3BXG for his pruning skills. The roof of the shack and the skylights have been cleared of debris/leaf litter (thanks Paul VK3TGX), the OCF is back up, and the inverted L has also been secured. In addition, thanks largely to the efforts of Steve VK3EGD, Michael VK3GHM and Ian VK3BUF, we now have an internet link in the shack. Thanks to all those members who attended on the day and assisted in the multitude of tasks, big and small, that were involved. The post-event BBQ revealed a number of deficiencies with our existing BBQ unit.

Licence fee structure: Russell VK3MWR advised that nothing more has been heard from Russell Broadbent MP, regarding any relief in terms of fees charged to amateurs for their licences.

Hamfest: Preparations for the hamfest are proceeding well, with just one table left. Both Rockby Electronics and Altronics have been approached for sponsorship, with the latter providing a frequency counter, and the former a lab grade power supply. There was some discussion re. the need to purchase door prizes, since it cuts into what would otherwise be profits for the club, and the idea of providing radios as door prizes. The view was put that we would not provide radios as door prizes, in case they were won by non-licensed persons. Additional suggestions for prizes were welcomed from the floor.

The question of the food to be provided at the hamfest was raised, and the prices for same, and it was agreed that we should obtain similar quantities of sausages/bread as last year, and maintain the same prices that were charged in 2013.

BBQ: In view of concerns expressed in previous meetings, and the difficulties experienced with the BBQ after the working bee, Albert VK3BQO agreed to look at suitable units, which he may be able to acquire at a discount, on account of personal contacts.

New business :

Letter from Ross Pittard re. the Victorian Advisory Technical Committee. Albert VK3BQO agreed to attend this event on 26 July on our behalf, which is looking at the future of the Victorian repeater network. Use of D-Star repeater: Albert VK3BQO and Rob VK3BRS agreed to attend this meeting, on 26 June, to gather further information about the future of the VK3RWN D-Star repeater system, and to report back to the club.

Internet Connection to the Shack: Steve VK3EGD detailed the 2.4GHz link which is now in place between his QTH and the clubrooms. A solid transmission path has been achieved, and Committee needs to make a decision about how this facility should be used to the benefit of the club. Thanks again to Steve, Ian and Michael for their work in bringing it to life. Amateur Radio articles: The RWD repeater antenna article, prepared by Ian VK3BUF, came up well. Ian advised that a further article on RWD will also be appearing in AR in coming months. Keep an eye out for it! Astronomical Society of Victoria: Following VK3CSJ Clint Jeffrey's talk on the radio astronomy work of the society, Russell VK3MWR suggested that the club consider making a donation towards their work. After further discussion, the suggestion was made that we provide practical assistance, in the form of a working bee/site visit at a future mutually convenient date.

Pub Night: The suggestion was made that we resurrect pub nights, which used to be a feature of club life some years ago. If this appeals to you, please speak to a Committee member.

Licence assessments: Graeme VK3BXG advised that he and Lee VK3GK would be doing assessments on Sunday 22 June.

RD Contest: A reminder that the RD Contest is fast approaching. Speak up if this takes your fancy -- you never know, there may be others who are also keen to take part.
